Students receive college scholarships

Housing Authority provides \$12,500 in college assistance to residents

The Housing Authority of San Bernardino County has awarded 15 students with a scholarship to help them pay for their college expenses. Over 60 applications were received from residents throughout the county.

Among the 15 recipients is Tamisha Newsom of Highland.

For 19 years, the Housing Authority has awarded scholarships to students throughout the county.

Students attending a four-year college or university received a \$1,000 scholarship while community and technical/vocational students received a \$500 scholarship. The Housing Authority uses non-public funds to promote educational success among their residents.

"These students are role models in the community and their stories are truly inspirational," said Susan Benner, Executive Director of the Housing Authority. "Tuition costs are on the rise and scholarships are scarce; therefore, we are thankful that these students can take with them a small scholarship to help them through their educational journey. We look forward to being able to continue to award more scholarships to hard working students throughout the years."
