Grant to aid shelter program

The San Bernardino County Housing Authority has been awarded a grant of nearly \$900,000 from the U.S. Department of Urban and Housing Development for its Shelter Plus Care Program.

The program provides services to homeless families and people with disabilities. The one-year renewal grant, announced in late December, is for \$896,400.

The county Housing Authority has been receiving the grants since 1996, enabling it to continue its relationship with the county Department of Behavioral Health, said Ana Gamiz, authority spokeswoman.

"Through this money, we can continue to provide housing assistance, while the Department of Behavioral Health provides families and individuals with a wide array of social services to help them become self-sufficient," Susan Benney, executive director of the Housing Authority, said in a news release.
